Here's what we accomplished in Phase 1.









## PHASE 1 NOW PROVIDES

### modern athletic spaces and locker rooms

- New girls' and boys' locker rooms that are now equal in size, a reflection of our student body evolution from 400 all boys to a current coed enrollment of 760.
- New and expanded athletic trainers' room and coaches' offices.
- Renovated lobby and Athletic Hall of Fame for McHugh Gymnasium.
- Renovated Panther Place (Panther apparel and snack shop).

## PHASE 1 NOW PROVIDES

### learning resource center

• New windows and ventilation system in Prep's Melonson Learning Resource Center (LRC). The LRC is a vital resource that serves close to 150 students every year.



### the arts

- Renovation of an underutilized space in the Lee Family Arts Center serves as a new studio for individual projects, pottery classes, and even a make-up and wardrobe space for Prep's outstanding theater program. With eight additional arts courses added over the last 10 years, the space is being put to good use.
- **New air conditioning system** in the Healy Chapel and Theater now provides relief for not only drama and choir performances, but for all community events.

### PHASE 2

Prep's substantial growth in enrollment, programming, and participation over the last 10 years has forced us to maximize every space on our limited urban campus. Historic highs is a "good" problem to have and, fortunately, an optimal solution is now available to Prep: The construction of a new multi-use facility—the Merlino Center—on the current Rudolf Athletic Field.

With real estate shrinking on campus as well as throughout the city of Seattle, athletic playing fields have also become a premium. The existing Rudolf Athletic Field will be be relocated to the undeveloped Delmar property located on the north side of campus.

### CAMPAIGN GOAL \$14.7 MILLION

### **PHASE 1 - COMPLETED!**

McDonnell Hall Renovations: locker rooms, athletic trainers' room, gym entrance, hall of fame, theater, arts studio, and learning resource center upgrades.

\$3.8 MILLION

#### **PHASE 2 - NEWLY RELAUNCHED**

Construction of the Merlino Center on current Rudolf Athletic Field and relocation of the field to the Delmar property.

\$10.9MILLION

### PHASE 2

### **PROGRAM IMPACT**


Construction of a new multi-use Merlino Center will provide:

- Athletic practice space with a surface suitable for multiple sports (volleyball, tennis, track, basketball, and baseball/softball batting cages).
- Capacity for multiple activities (PULSE dance team, robotics tournaments, grade-level meetings, lunch overflow, and social events).
- Additional space for HEX (Health and Exercise Science) classes.
- 5,000 square foot, two-level weight room and dynamic training area.









### PHASE 2

### THE DOMINO EFFECT





It's not only the addition of new space that makes this campaign significant, but also the indirect impact made to our program as a result of the reallocation of space.

• The **Rudolf Athletic Field**, currently on the site where the Merlino Center will be built, will be moved to Prep's undeveloped property on the north side of Delmar Drive.


Breathing life into this vacant lot will invigorate curricular (HEX classes) and co-curricular programming (lacrosse, soccer, football, track). Practice space is at a premium throughout Seattle. Prep is fortunate to own this undeveloped property so close to campus; the time is right to develop it for use by our students.

• 5,000 square foot, two-level weight room and dynamic training area. Once the current strength and cardio programming is moved to the Merlino Center, Aldephia Memorial Hall will make room for three new academic-focused spaces.


### MAKING ROOM FOR LEARNING



Additional spaces in Adelphia Memorial Hall suitable for a reimagined technology center, an additional classroom, and a robotics center:

- 1. The relocation of the existing **Firmani Flex Tech Space** allows for a larger learning space and additional programming, both academic and co-curricular.
- 2. Classrooms are at a premium given our expanded offerings and high enrollment. An additional benefit of the Merlino Center is an **additional classroom**.
- 3. Our **robotics program** is currently relegated to a storage room due to lack of space. Moving the cardio program to the Merlino Center will open up space in Adelphia Memorial Hall for a Robotics Center.
