

Seattle Preparatory School – Senior Year Courses

In the 12th grade year, students are required to take a minimum of six classes one semester and five classes the other semester; students taking two or more AP classes are required to take a minimum of five classes each semester. All students take a one-semester integrated course during the second semester called Senior Seminar, which count towards Theology credit. All seniors take a full year of English.

Social Studies (elective choice)	Students may choose one of the following: AP European History (year-long) AP Economics: both Macro & Micro (year-long) AP Government and Politics (year-long) US Government (semester-long) Contemporary World Problems (semester-long)	1.0 credit or 0.5 credit (dependent on course)
Mathematics (elective choice)	Students typically continue along with the next appropriate course in the math sequence (click here).	1.0 credit (per course)
Science (elective choice)	Students in the Class of 2022 and beyond will take: Anatomy & Physiology AP Environmental Science AP Physics C AP Chemistry AP Biology Physics	1.0 credit (per course)
Senior Seminar (required) *counts towards Theology credit.	Student choose one of the following Senior Seminar courses: ... And Justice for All Disease and Social Responsibility Good and Evil Peace Studies	0.5 credit

World Language (elective choice)	Students can continue with a level 4 World Language, if sufficient enrollment.	1.0 credit (per course)
